

THE DUKE OF EDINBURGH'S AWARD

We are so pleased to announce that we will once again provide our students with the opportunity to complete The Duke of Edinburgh's Award (DofE). This year, we are offering the Bronze Award to students in Year 9, the Silver Award to students in Year 10 and the Gold Award to students in Year 12.

About the DofE

The DofE is non-competitive and open to all young people – it's about setting personal challenges and pushing personal boundaries. There are three levels of the DofE programme which, when successfully completed, lead to a Bronze, Silver or Gold Award.

Through their DofE, students will make memories and build traits like confidence, resilience and self-esteem, which benefits mental health. They will gain skills and attributes for work and life, like problem-solving, teamwork and self-

motivation. Students will achieve an award that's recognised by top employers to help them stand out when applying for university, apprenticeships or jobs.

To achieve their award, participants must complete four sections: Skills, Volunteering, Physical and their Expedition. At the Gold level, students complete a fifth section, the Residential.

Every young person's DofE programme is personal to them, they can choose what they would like to do for their Skills, Volunteering and Physical sections, and most activities can count. We will provide guidance and support, and students can either choose to continue an activity they already do or discover something completely new.



We are so excited to see how our students get on this year and wish them the best of luck with their awards.

The next half-term marks the prestigious launch of the Ashlawn Pillars Award, a new initiative designed for students in Years 7, 8 and 9. Students are encouraged to make a pledge linked to each of the Ashlawn Care Pillars.

- 1 **Community –** students will select a volunteering opportunity to pledge their commitment.
- 2 **Aspiration** they will commit to learning new skills.
- 3 **Respect for Nature** students will choose a pledge that demonstrates their care for the environment.
- 4 **Excellence** students will pledge to showcase their talents in physical, creative or musical activities.

To achieve their pledges, students must provide evidence of their participation and the time they have dedicated to fulfilling each pledge. They are required to demonstrate this on 3/4/5 occasions or commit to 3/4/5 weeks, depending on their year group (Year 7, 8 or 9).

Upon successful completion and submission of evidence, students will receive the Community, Aspiration, Respect, or Excellence Pillar Award. All students have the opportunity to earn all four Pillar Awards. The pledges made can be personal and unique to each student.

Certifications will be presented during the Celebration Assemblies to recognise your achievements. We look forward to seeing your progress in the coming term!


CRIMINOLOGY AND SOCIAL SCIENCE

YEAR 13 GEOGRAPHY FIELDWORK TRIP TO **SHREWSBURY**

This year, our Year 13 Geographers were lucky to catch a break in the weather for their fieldwork trip to Shrewsbury. After days of rain, they enjoyed sunshine and clear skies for their NEA preparation and data collection.

The A-level Geography course requires students to complete an independent investigation worth 20% of their final grade. To develop essential skills in urban studies, carbon storage and infiltration rates, students visited the Preston Montford Field Study Centre. Each student then created their own unique investigation title before heading out 'in the field' for data collection. The trip provided opportunities for A-level content revision through scavenger hunts and games, making it both productive and fun.

Now, the NEA write-up begins in lessons, and we look forward to seeing the completed submissions at Christmas. Best of luck to our Year 13 Geographers as they start on this exciting project!

BOYS FOOTBALL FIXTURES

The Boys' Football team has had an impressive season, completing over 35 fixtures across multiple year groups. Each year group competes in the Rugby District School League, going up against seven other schools in the area and their results have been outstanding.

The Year 10 team, last year's Warwickshire County Champions, finished the league undefeated with a 100% record. Meanwhile, both the Year 8 and Year 9 teams are currently in first place as they approach their final fixture.

The Year 11 and Year 7 teams are also performing well, sitting in second and fifth place, respectively. Special congratulations to the Year 7 team, who performed exceptionally after a rigorous and competitive trial process!

In addition to their league participation, the teams are competing in the prestigious English Schools FA Cup (ESFA).

Both the Year 9 and Year 10 teams have advanced to the third round, an outstanding achievement! We will keep you updated on their progress as they continue in this competition.

Furthermore, our teams will be defending their title in the Warwickshire County Schools Football

A special mention goes to Max and Brody (Year 10), Rudy (Year 9) and Zane (Year 8), who are all involved in professional football academies outside of school.

Max currently trains two full days a week at Derby County and has competed in the prestigious Floodlight Cup against teams such as Nottingham Forest, Stoke City and Leicester City.

Looking ahead, we are excited to introduce basketball fixtures, an extra-curricular Badminton Club open to everyone and Rugby School Badminton Tournaments.


SCIENCE
